#### 1. IEA 2009 Congress Update

#### 1.1 Submission of Papers

#### 10. World Health Organization Initiative

During March, I will be representing the IEA at the International Commission on Occupational Health (ICOH) Congress in Cape Town, South Africa. During this Congress, there will be a meeting with representatives involved in the WHO Global Plan of Action. The WHO is looking at adopting a standard model for professional contribution of advice relating to workplace health. During February, I circulated a letter to the IEA Technical Committees on MSD and ODAM as the initial targeted areas of participation in evaluating this model for the WHO. # 11. Meetings during March

I am currently looking forward to a number of very important IEA meetings during March. These include the representation of the IEA at the ICOH Congress in Cape Town, South Africa. The IEA Executive will be having a sub-EC meeting in Amsterdam, The Netherlands, to discuss the future strategies for EQUID, Certification, and education program accreditation. This will be our final meeting prior to the Council in August.

I have been delighted to accept an invitation from the Ergonomics Society in The Netherlands to participate at their conference in Zeist. The organizational support provided by the Society for the sub-EC meeting and hospitality is greatly appreciated. I am also proposing to visit Bahrain for an inaugural meeting the Bahrain Ergonomics Society and also in Dubai to investigate the formation of a new network or regional Ergonomics Society in this part of the world.

We look forward to providing further IEA activity information in the next Newsletter during March 2009.
