## Format

Paper must be written in English; refer to the format as follows.

Paper size: A4 (two-column format)
Text: 2, 4 or 6 pages
Margins: See Table 1
Typefaces:
Text, Abstract and Keywords 10 point
Times roman type (or similar)
Title 16 point, with initial capital for first word
Authors' name 12 point, initial capitals, centered
Affiliations $\quad 12$ point, initial capitals, centered Headings 12 point, initial capitals, for first word bold type

Citations to references: Use the numerical system [1].
References should be numbered sequentially throughout the text [2, 3].
